RESURRECTIONAL TROPARION IN TONE SEVEN

By Thy <u>Cross</u> Thou didst destroy <u>death</u>. / To the thief Thou didst open <u>Par</u>adise. / For the <u>Myrrh-</u>bearers Thou didst change weeping into <u>joy</u>, / and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, / to pro<u>claim</u> that Thou art <u>risen</u>, // granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

FESTAL TROPARION IN TONE ONE

When <u>Thou</u>, O Lord, wast baptized in the <u>Jor</u>dan, / the worship of the Trinity was made <u>manifest</u>. / For the <u>voice</u> of the Father bore <u>wit</u>ness to Thee, / and called Thee His be<u>lov</u>ed Son; / and the <u>Spirit</u> in the form of a <u>dove</u> / confirmed the <u>truth</u>fulness of His word. / O <u>Christ</u> our God, Who hast re<u>vealed</u> Thyself // and hast enlightened the world, <u>glory</u> to Thee.

RESURRECTIONAL KONTAKION IN TONE SEVEN

The do<u>minion</u> of death can no longer hold men <u>cap</u>tive, / for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>powers</u>. / Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets re<u>joice</u> and cry: / "The Savior has come to those in faith; // enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection!"

FESTAL KONTAKION IN TONE FOUR

Today Thou hast shone forth to the <u>world</u>, O Lord, / and the light of Thy countenance has been <u>marked</u> on us. / Knowing Thee, we sing Thy <u>praises</u>: / "Thou hast come and re<u>vealed</u> Thyself, // O unap<u>proach</u>able Light."

PROKEIMENON IN TONE SEVEN

The Lord shall give strength to His people. The Lord shall bless His people with peace.

v. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord!

The prokeimenon in Tone Four: Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord. God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us.

THE EPISTLE

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Ephesians. (6:10-17)

Brethren, finally, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh

and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

ALLELUIA IN TONE SEVEN

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

- v. It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to Thy Name, O Most High.
- v. To declare Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night.
- v. Bring to the Lord, O sons of God, bring to the Lord young rams.

THE GOSPEL

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (18:35-43)

Then it happened, as He was coming near Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the road begging. And hearing a multitude passing by, he asked what it meant. So they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Then those who went before warned him that he should be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be brought to Him. And when he had come near, He asked him, saying, "What do you want Me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, that I may receive my sight." Then Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

FESTAL MEGALYNARION

Verse: Magnify, O my soul, the most pure Virgin Theotokos, more honorable than the heavenly hosts!

Hirmos: No tongue knows how to praise thee worthily, O Theotokos; / even angels are overcome with awe praising thee. / But since thou art good, accept our faith; / for thou knowest our love inspired by God! / Thou art the defender of Christians, and we magnify thee.

COMMUNION HYMNS

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! The grace of God has appeared for the salvation of all men. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
