RESURRECTIONAL TROPARION IN TONE SIX

The Angelic <u>Powers</u> were at Thy tomb; / the guards became as <u>dead</u> men. / Mary <u>stood</u> by Thy grave, / seeking Thy most pure <u>body</u>. / Thou didst capture hell not being <u>tempted</u> by it. / Thou didst come to the Virgin, <u>granting</u> life. / O Lord, Who didst <u>rise</u> from the dead, // <u>glo</u>ry to Thee.

FESTAL TROPARION IN TONE ONE

When <u>Thou</u>, O Lord, wast baptized in the <u>Jor</u>dan, / the worship of the Trinity was made <u>manifest</u>. / For the <u>voice</u> of the Father bore <u>wit</u>ness to Thee, / and called Thee His be<u>lov</u>ed Son; / and the <u>Spir</u>it in the form of a <u>dove</u> / confirmed the <u>truth</u>fulness of His word. / O <u>Christ</u> our God, Who hast re<u>vealed</u> Thyself // and hast enlightened the world, glory to Thee.

TROPARION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST IN TONE TWO

The <u>mem</u>ory of the righteous is celebrated with <u>hymns</u> of praise, / but the Lord's testimony is sufficient for thee, O <u>Fore</u>runner. / Thou wast <u>shown</u> in truth to be the most honorable of the <u>Proph</u>ets, / for thou wast deemed worthy to baptize in the streams of the Jordan <u>Him</u> Whom they foretold. / <u>There</u>fore, having suffered for the <u>truth</u> with joy, / thou didst proclaim to those in hell God Who appeared in the flesh, / Who <u>takes</u> away the <u>sin</u> of the world, // and grants us <u>great mercy</u>.

KONTAKION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST IN TONE SIX

The river Jordan trembled, and was <u>driven</u> back, / filled with fear at Thy <u>coming</u> in the flesh, / while John drew <u>back</u> in awe / as he fulfilled the ministry of the <u>Spirit</u>. / The ranks of Angels <u>stood</u> amazed / when they beheld Thee <u>bap</u>tized in the stream. / And we who were in darkness are <u>filled</u> with light. // We praise Thee, O God made manifest, as Thou dost enlighten all.

FESTAL KONTAKION IN TONE FOUR

Today Thou hast shone forth to the <u>world</u>, O Lord, / and the light of Thy countenance has been <u>marked</u> on us. / Knowing Thee, we sing Thy praises: / "Thou hast come and revealed Thyself, // O unapproachable Light."

PROKEIMENON IN TONE ONE

Let Thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on Thee!

v. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just!

The prokeimenon in the 7th tone. The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord and shall hope in Him.

THE EPISTLE

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Ephesians. (4:7-13)

Brethren, to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, and gave gifts to men." (Now this, "He ascended" – what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.

The Reading from the Acts of the Holy Apostles. (19:1-8)

In those days, it happened, while Apollos was at Corinth, that Paul, having passed through the upper regions, came to Ephesus. And finding some disciples he said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" So they said to him, "We have not so much as heard whether there is a Holy Spirit." And he said to them, "Into what then were you baptized?" So they said, "Into John's baptism." Then Paul said, "John indeed baptized with a baptism of repentance, saying to the people that they should believe on Him who would come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus." When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke with tongues and prophesied. Now the men were about twelve in all. And he went into the synagogue and spoke boldly for three months, reasoning and persuading concerning the things of the kingdom of God.

ALLELUIA IN TONE FIVE

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

- v. I will sing of Thy mercies, O Lord, forever; with my mouth I will proclaim Thy truth from generation to generation.
- v. For Thou hast said: Mercy will be established forever; Thy truth will be prepared in the heavens.
- v. Light dawns for the righteous, and joy for the upright in heart.

THE GOSPEL

The Reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (4:12-17)

Now when Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, He departed to Galilee. And leaving Nazareth, He came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the regions of Zebulun and Naphtali, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, by the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles: The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and upon those who sat in the region and shadow of death Light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

The Reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. John. (1:29-34)

The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is He of whom I said, 'After me comes a Man who is preferred before me, for He was before me.' I did not know Him; but that He should be revealed to Israel, therefore I came baptizing with water." And John bore witness, saying, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and He remained upon Him. I did not know Him, but He who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God."

FESTAL MEGALYNARION

Verse: Magnify, O my soul, the most pure Virgin Theotokos, more honorable than the heavenly hosts!

Hirmos: No tongue knows how to praise thee worthily, O Theotokos; / even angels are overcome with awe praising thee. / But since thou art good, accept our faith; / for thou knowest our love inspired by God! / Thou art the defender of Christians, and we magnify thee.

COMMUNION HYMNS

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance! He shall not fear evil tidings! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
